Teams working on Life Science projects on their way from idea to product face several challenges. In addition to producing excellent science, they need to prove reliability of results, validate and confirm data, and prototype products out of their ideas. In order for these products to successfully enter the market, teams need to develop breakthrough business models and innovative strategies.
