This training is open to all early career female scientists who would like to improve their rhetorical skills, their ability to stay calm in challenging situations, and their influence in group discussions.

<u>Trainer Liane Dannenberg-Schütte</u> will guide participants through a day of impulse talks, selfreflection using checklists, small group exercises, and a simulated committee meeting followed by a structured evaluation. Topics will include:

- Micro-politics and exercise of power, legitimate and illegitimate influence, how to win influence within the group
- Psychodynamics in social situations, the TA model and OK positions in verbal expressions and body language
- Rhetorical elements for pro-active conversations: Female and male patterns in communication, how to argue, active listening, and how to lead by asking questions
- Tools to deal with difficult situations: How to cope with killer phrases, the HAIFA and the SEKT model, repartee and objection handling
